LOSST

In every newsletter, I am tasked with writing about important things happening with Marshall County Conservation. Of all the newsletter articles that I have written in my young career as conservation director, this may be one of the most important so far. No pressure!

On March 4, unincorporated cities and rural residents of Marshall County will participate in a special election to vote for Local Option Sales and Service Tax (LOSST). LOSST is a 1% tax charged on the same items charged a 6% sales tax. Hence, we pay 7% on purchases in Marshall County.

A few false rumors have been circulating about LOSST, and I want to clear the air before the vote. Many believe this is a new tax; however, it has been around since 1985, and it is not new to Marshall County and its communities. Currently, all the incorporated towns in Marshall County, including Marshalltown, have passed and are receiving funding from LOSST. Even the unincorporated communities of Marshall County previously voted and passed LOSST in 2015, and this vote is to renew that funding source. So, NO, your taxes will not be increasing with this vote.

Another rumor is that you will pay less taxes if LOSST doesn't pass. This is also false. LOSST will still be collected on purchases. However, instead of these funds going to county services, they will be distributed elsewhere. This vote ensures that rural voters decide that their tax dollars stay in the county and help with rural services.

Approximately 1.7 million dollars of LOSST funding goes to Marshall County every year. 50% of these funds go

towards bridge, roadway, and culvert repairs. The remaining 50% is considered property tax relief and goes to county services provided by the conservation, sheriff, emergency management,



veterans affairs, treasurer, auditor, and other county departments. It is considered property tax relief because many of these services, like



road repairs, sheriff services, etc., are necessary, and if the funding doesn't come from LOSST, then it would need to come from property taxes. So, if LOSST doesn't pass, your property taxes may increase to cover these services.

You may be asking, why is this so important to Marshall County Conservation? If LOSST doesn't pass, hard decisions will need to be made on the priority of services offered in the county. Every dollar Marshall County Conservation receives from the taxpayer is given to us with the belief and trust that we will ensure those dollars are well spent. We stretch those dollars using grants and donations. We decrease costs by completing projects inhouse if possible. Our hard-working staff works alongside volunteers to complete projects more quickly and save the county money. At the end of the day, we accomplish a lot with the little we are given. If LOSST doesn't pass, the little we receive will become smaller, and even though we will still go to work every day to make Marshall County Parks the jewels of this county, it will be much more difficult, and services could become more limited.

We understand that taxes are not the most enjoyable thing we spend our money on, but if you live in rural Marshall

County, you have the opportunity on March 4th to decide what your taxes support. Please take the time to learn more about this upcoming special election and get out and vote!
